

Feed Supplier's Certificate

In 1997, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) implemented a rule that prohibits the feeding of most mammalian-derived animal protein to ruminant animals. Many meat packers are requiring livestock sellers to certify that the livestock to be slaughtered (harvested) have been fed in compliance with this FDA regulation. Thus, the herein identified youth who owns ruminant livestock for exhibition requests your help in documenting that the feed they purchased from you was prepared in compliance with the FDA regulation.

The undersigned feed supplier certifies that none of the livestock feed provided for the purposes of feeding to cattle, sheep, or goats to the livestock owner identified below contained prohibited mammalian tissue, e.g. ruminant meat and bone meal, as defined in the FDA Directive 21 CFR 589.2000.
