

# 180 Learning to Jump

## Skill Level: Intermediate

### For county project COMPLETION members must complete either:

- Submit all paperwork by the appropriate deadlines
- Complete EquiStep by July 1<sup>st</sup>
- Be a 4-H Member in Good Standing by meeting all club and county requirements
- Completed Project Book & Records
- Participate in Skill-a-thon & Project Book Check Days
- Obtain your animal by the required ownership & possession date

NOTE: 4-H members may also choose to exhibit their animals at the Brown County Junior Fair. Members are NOT required to exhibit at the fair to complete a 4-H project. But a project MUST be completed to be eligible for exhibition.

### State Fair Qualification

- Qualify at a recognized Ohio PAS Show

### For Project Judging Dates & Times:

### Complete All of the following for completion:

- Planning Your Project section
- All project areas
- At least 2 learning experiences
- At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities
- Complete the judging description of your horse
- One-page report
- Complete 190R Equine Record Book

### What to bring to Skill-a-thon & Project Book Check:

- Completed Project Book
- Completed 190R Equine Record Book up to date of book checks

### County Fair Exhibit

- Horse or Pony carried as project
- Follow all Ohio 4-H and Junior Fair Deadlines, Rules, and Regulations

### State Fair:

- Submit all paperwork by deadlines
- Coggins test completed by OSF deadline and submitted to Extension Office
- EquiStep completed by June 1st

Note: Members enrolled in multiple animal projects that require skill-a-thon & book check must complete at least one skill-a-thon & book check for a project they are enrolled to be eligible for exhibition of all their animal projects. They are encouraged to complete skill-a-thon & book checks for all projects they are enrolled.

- The exception for this is members in Beef, Sheep, & Swine, these members MUST complete skill-a-thon for each of those species to be eligible to exhibit.
- If your species offers an Outstanding Exhibitor Award you may be required to complete skill-a-thon & book checks to be eligible for awards in that category.
