

758 Western Heritage Project

Skill Level: Intermediate/Advanced

For county project COMPLETION members must complete either:

- County Project Judging in September
- Must attend the following:
 - At least ONE Safety Meeting
 - At least SIX discipline meetings (6 meetings for EACH Shooting Sports project taken)
- Member is eligible for Exhibition and Fair Awards; project must be displayed for award eligibility.
- Advisor Grade
 - Completed by advisor. If done by September 15th projects are eligible for fair exhibition but is NOT eligible for fair awards.

State Fair Qualification

- Participate in July Judging – State Fair Qualification Only. ALL projects must be brought back in September to be eligible for county awards.

Complete All of the following for completion:

- Process through levels 1-3 by creating a project notebook; setting and working to accomplish three goals per level; completing at least one required and three elective activities for each sub-level (Historical Inquiry, Firearms and Shooting, and Clothing and Accoutrements); and completing a shooting requirement. See project book for details.
- Must be enrolled in a Shooting Sports program under the direction of a certified instructor

What to bring to judging:

- Completed project book
- Shooting sports projects must attend a required amount of clinics (6) in their discipline as well as have their project book signed by a state certified instructor within that discipline, or they will not be eligible for judging.
- Pictures are acceptable. Do not bring firearms or parts of firearm to judging.

County Fair Exhibit

- Educational display or poster
- NOTE: NO FIREARMS OR PARTS OF A FIREARM ALLOWED IN THE DISPLAY – Pictures are ok.

State Fair:

- Selected during county-level competition in July.
- Event: Shooting Sports Day
